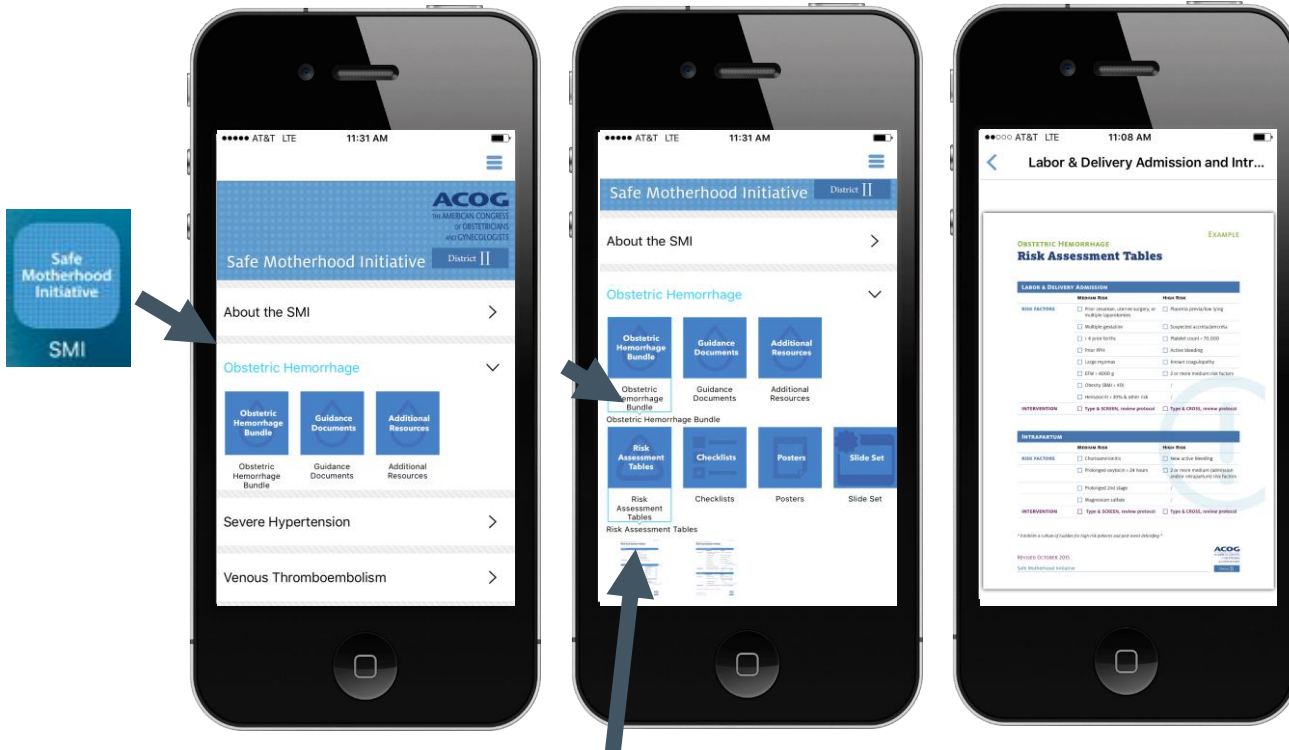

Example Client Success Stories

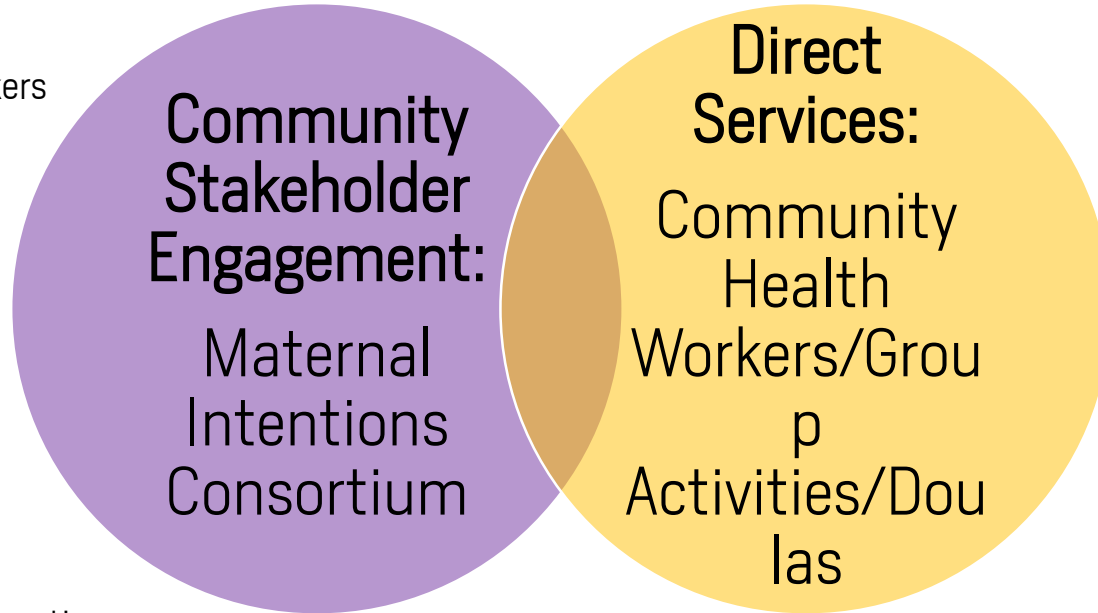
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Client 2: “I was at the end of my rope if I hadn’t spoken to my CHW.” She was obese, hypertensive, pre-diabetic, living in over-crowded domestic violence conditions with her 4 month old daughter. She has since graduated from MI and is:

- safe living in a shelter
- able to speak some English
- completed job training course
- started working
- no longer pre-diabetic
- 185 lbs (down from 205 lbs)
- 129/78 blood pressure (down from 157/106)

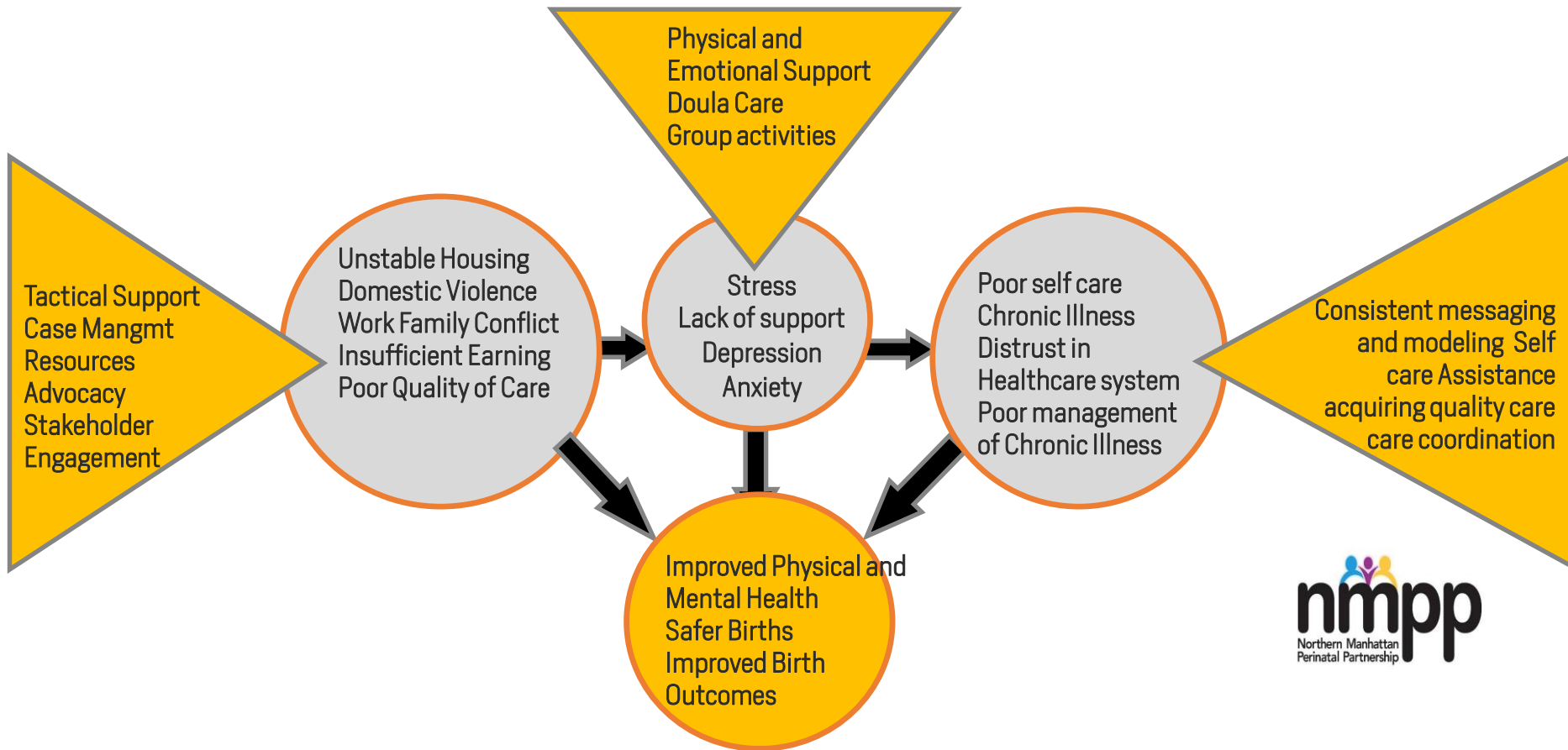
